



Abstract

A Study on the Homogeneity of South and North Korean Colonial History for Reconciliation

The purpose of this study is to find ways for the two Koreas to cooperate through the history of colonial damage shared by the two Koreas.

To this end, this study first examines the differences in historical perceptions of the two Koreas. Second, it describes the damages shared by the two Koreas, caused by colonial rule of Japanese imperialism. Third, it explores the possibility of completing the common history textbooks of the two Koreas by comparing and analyzing the existing history textbooks of the two Koreas.

Lastly, as an inter-Korean cooperation plan, it is proposed to establish a “Joint Investigation Committee (tentative name)” on the damages of Japanese colonial rule.
